## Intensive Summer Program 2017

**Duration:** All classes meet M/W/F from Monday, June 26 - Friday July 28 (5 weeks)

**Audience:** Students entering 11th or 12th grade

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### **Design Lab: Introduction to Architecture and Interior Architecture**

M/W/F, 9AM - 12:30PM 2-unit Studio Course

Design Lab introduces high school students to principles of experimentation and design. Taught by inspired design faculty, the course is organized within a framework of thinking, drawing and making. Students are immersed in a studio environment and will work in on-campus computer and digital fabrication labs, experimenting with 3D printing and laser cutting, and learning about architecture and interior architecture through traditional and digital hand drawing, material experimentation, and model-making exercises. The course explores the practice and promise of alternative methods of design thinking. Prerequisites: None

### **Introduction to Professional Writing**

M/W/F, 10:00AM - 12:30PM 3-unit Lecture Course

Introduction to Professional Writing explores the "journey of ideas to the published page" (Sam Gragga). This course provides an overview of the study of writing as a profession and its connections to other disciplines. It includes introductory focused experiences in digital and multimodal writing, including blogging and social media, journalism, cross-cultural writing, and creative writing. The course asks students to consider writing as a creative and ethical practice that goes beyond persuasion and information to engage in collaboration and community building. Prerequisites: None

### **The Art and Design Portfolio**

M/W/F, 9AM - 12:30PM 2-unit Studio Course

Through this course, students learn to develop their design and drawing skills and create work for their college entrance portfolio. Emphasis is placed on developing creative design concepts, gaining practical problem-solving skills, and learning the fundamentals of freehand observational drawing. The course culminates in a project of the students' choice related to the professions of Graphic Design, Game Art, Fashion Design, or Animation. Prerequisites: None

### **Smart Money**

M/W/F, 10:00AM - 12:30PM 3-unit Lecture Course

This course is designed to help young people better manage their careers and finances. Topics covered are obtaining a job, planning and managing one's career, spending and budgeting, saving and investing, loans and mortgages, credit, insurance, identity theft, and taxes. Prerequisites: none
