## Exam Notes:

Students must be on track with their Architectural Experience Program (AXP) hours to be in the IPAL program and to be eligible to take the ARE.

As long as students remain in IPAL, they remain eligible to take the exams.

Candidates can take the California Supplemental Exam after completing all other licensure requirements, including the education & experience requirements. Candidates who pass all these requirements will become licensed architects.
