This reaffirmation of what is considered "the gold standard" of business schools and is only granted to about 5% of business schools worldwide, underscores once again the superb quality of education and thought leadership cultivated at our School of Business.




Sofia Toro Advises Upcoming Generations to Consider Woodbury University

FACULTY HIGHLIGHTS



Professor Wendy Bendoni, Chair of Fashion Marketing, conducted a keynote speech at the *Journées du Marketing Horloger* 2023 event at the Musée International d'Horlogerie in La Chaux-de-Fonds, last winter.

The event was focused on "New Business Models" in the luxury world, and Professor Bendoni shared her research with brands such as Omega in breakout sessions. Her research, titled "The Next Frontier of Luxury Watch Marketing: Multidisciplinary Perspective of Co-Creation Through Immersive Technology," was selected for the JIMH journal. This research focuses on digital storytelling through immersive technology experiences, with a multidisciplinary approach that considers technology innovation, user experience (UX), and the evolution of digital cultures' attitudes, behaviors, and expectations. The research looks at digital disruption that has challenged marketers and management as new roles within the luxury business model continue to grow.

The Journées du Marketing Horloger event has an international audience and combines the academic and professional worlds around avant-garde themes. This unique event offers participants a 360° vision of current knowledge and trends in watch marketing that is lively, organic, and evolving.

Dr. Joan Marques, Dean and Professor of Management, just had "*Fuhren mit Hertz*" published through Springer Gabler. This is the German translation of her original work, titled, "*Lead with Heart in Mind: Treading the Noble Eightfold Path for Mindful and Sustainable Practice.*"

This book explores leadership from a Buddhist psychological perspective and introduces the Buddhist construct of the Noble Eightfold Path to generate future-oriented leadership. Written in a conversational tone, this

book features practical examples, interactive questions, and chapter summaries to promote self-reflection as well as discussion. A wide array of examples and cases are also included, describing the behavioral patterns and accomplishments from leaders such as Elon Musk, Malala Yousafzai, Howard Schultz, Muhammad Yunus, and Millard Fuller.
