FAQS

1 What is a transfer student?

Transfer applicants are high school graduates who have completed a minimum of 24 transferable units at the time of application. Any applicant with fewer than 24 units at the time of application should apply as a freshman.

2 How do I apply as a transfer student?

Apply online at woodbury.edu/apply and submit your official transcripts from your community college or university. If you do not have an Associates degree, you will need to submit your high school transcript or high school equivalent such as a GED or CHSPE. Personal statements and letters of recommendation are not required, though you are welcome to include them with your application. If you are applying for a design major, follow the instructions for submitting a portfolio of your work.

3 Do you have GPA requirements for admission?

The minimum, unweighted GPA for regular admission is 2.75 or above. Applicants with a GPA between 2.50–2.74 will be reviewed for admissions into the Transition Track program. Applicants with a GPA between 2.25–2.49 will be reviewed for admissions into the Bridge Program.

4 When are the application deadlines?

Woodbury has rolling admission, which means that applicants can apply at any time. However, for the best consideration for admission and merit-based scholarships, please keep the priority deadlines in mind:

Fall semester: March 1

Spring semester: November 1

5 Do you offer scholarships to transfer students?

YES! Domestic and International transfer applicants are eligible for the following merit-based scholarships:

→ **PRESIDENTIAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP**

For applicants with a 3.70 and above GPA
\$20,000 per year

→ **DEAN MERIT SCHOLARSHIP**

For applicants with a 3.40–3.69 GPA
\$18,000 per year

→ **WOODBURY GRANT**

For applicants with a 2.95–3.39 GPA
\$12,000 per year

For applicants with a 2.50–2.94 GPA
\$8,000 per year

In addition, students are eligible for the Woodbury Integrated Student Experience (WISE) scholarship of \$2,000 if they have a GPA of 2.75 or higher.

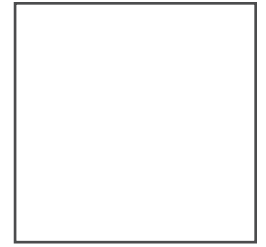
